## Dataset metadata

This dataset provides 2011 Census estimates that classify dependent children in England and Wales by number of bedrooms, by accommodation type and by age of dependent children. The estimates are as at census day, 27 March 2011.

### Statistical Disclosure Control

In order to protect against disclosure of personal information from the 2011 Census, there has been swapping of records in the Census database between different geographic areas, and so some counts will be affected. In the main, the greatest effects will be at the lowest geographies, since the record swapping is targeted towards those households with unusual characteristics in small areas.

## Variables

### geography

The following types of geography are available:

NHS area teams, clinical commissioning groups, built-up areas including subdivisions, built-up areas, national assembly for wales electoral regions 2010, postcode areas, postcode districts, postcode sectors, national assembly for wales constituencies 2010, parishes 2011, 2011 local health boards, 2011 wards, 2011 super output areas - middle layer, 2011 super output areas - lower layer, 2011 output areas, local enterprise partnerships (as of April 2017), parliamentary constituencies 2010, former metropolitan counties, local authorities: county / unitary (prior to April 2015), local authorities: district / unitary (prior to April 2015), regions, countries

### Bedrooms

#### Bedroom

A bedroom is defined as any room that was intended to be used as a bedroom when the property was built, or any

room that has been permanently converted for use as a bedroom. It also includes all rooms intended for use as a bedroom even if not being used as a bedroom at the time of the Census. Bedsits and studio flats are counted as having one bedroom.

'1 bedroom' includes households who indicated '0 bedrooms' and '1 bedroom'. This is because all households where someone usually lives must have at least one room used as a bedroom.

The following Bedrooms are available:

- | 2 bedrooms
- | 3 bedrooms
- | 4 or more bedrooms

## Age of dependent child

### Age

Age is derived from the date of birth question and is a person's age at their last birthday, at 27 March 2011. Dates of birth that imply an age over 115 are treated as invalid and the person's age is imputed. Infants less than one year old are classified as 0 years of age.

The following Age of dependent child are available:

- | All categories: Age of dependent child
- | Age 0 to 9
- | Age 10 to 18

## Accommodation type

### Accommodation type

This refers to the type of accommodation used or available for use by an individual household. Examples include the whole of a terraced house, or a flat in a purpose-built block of flats.

Flat, maisonette or apartment, or mobile/temporary accommodation' includes all household types that are not a whole house or bungalow.

This means either a flat, maisonette or apartment that is:

- | in a purpose-built block of flats or tenement,
- | part of a converted or shared house (including bed-sits). or
- | in a commercial building (for example, in an office building, hotel, or over a shop);

or a caravan or other mobile or temporary structure.

The following Accommodation type are available:

- | All categories: Accommodation type
- | Whole house or bungalow: Total
- | Whole house or bungalow: Detached
- | Whole house or bungalow: Semi-detached
- | Whole house or bungalow: Terraced (including end-terrace)
- | Flat, maisonette or apartment, or mobile/temporary accommodation
