Dataset metadata

This dataset provides 2011 Census estimates that classify usual residents aged 16 and over in employment the week before the census in Wales by ability to speak Welsh and by occupation. The estimates are as at census day, 27 March 2011.

Statistical Disclosure Control

In order to protect against disclosure of personal information from the 2011 Census, there has been swapping of records in the Census database between different geographic areas, and so some counts will be affected. In the main, the greatest effects will be at the lowest geographies, since the record swapping is targeted towards those households with unusual characteristics in small areas.

Occupation

A person's occupation relates to their main job and is derived from either their job title or details of the activities involved in their job. This is used to assign responses to an occupation code based on the Standard Occupational Classification 2010 (SOC2010).

Ability to Speak Welsh

Welsh language skills

A person aged three and over is classified with skills in Welsh if they can do one or more of the following:

- | understand spoken Welsh,
- | speak Welsh,
- | read Welsh, or
- | write Welsh.

In results that classify people by Welsh language skills a person may appear in more than one category depending on which combination of skills they have.
