Dataset metadata

This dataset provides 2011 Census estimates that classify the out of term population in Wales aged 3 and over by Welsh language skills. The estimates are as at census day, 27 March 2011. The out of term population is a redistribution of the usually resident population to their place of residence in out of term periods. Students who reported a second address that was a student's home address are counted at that second address. Students that did not provide an out of term address and usual residents who are not students are counted at their usual residence.

Statistical Disclosure Control

In order to protect against disclosure of personal information from the 2011 Census, there has been swapping of records in the Census database between different geographic areas, and so some counts will be affected. In the main, the greatest effects will be at the lowest geographies, since the record swapping is targeted towards those households with unusual characteristics in small areas.

built-up areas including subdivisions, built-up areas, national assembly for wales electoral regions 2010, national assembly for wales constituencies 2010, parishes 2011, 2011 local health boards, 2011 wards, 2011 super output areas - middle layer, 2011 super output areas - lower layer, 2011 output areas, local enterprise partnerships (as of April 2017), parliamentary constituencies 2010, local authorities: county / unitary (prior to April 2015), local authorities: district / unitary (prior to April 2015), regions, countries

Welsh Language Skills

A person aged three and over is classified with skills in Welsh if they can do one or more of the following:

- I understand spoken Welsh,

- | speak Welsh,
- | read Welsh, or
- | write Welsh.

In results that classify people by Welsh language skills a person may appear in more than one category depending on which combination of skills they have.

People could tick more than one option, so may appear in this dataset multiple times.

The table category 'Studies in England' includes full-time students and schoolchildren who are usually resident in England during term-time but living in Wales outside of term-time. They are not asked the question on Welsh language skills and are therefore not included in the categories that show the distribution of Welsh language skills.
